Prop 499 NO	City of Glendale California based Worker Program Initiative mandating creation of City Labor Department costing \$1 million per year, adding many burdensome business regulations and immediately increasing minimum wage by 40%
Prop 496 YES	City of Peoria Renew the Franchise Agreement with EPCOR Water Arizona to continue servicing 2,200 Peoria customers
NO	City of Phoenix Prop 487: Local Alternative Spending Limit Yes Vote will allow spending over state limits
	Prop 488: General Plan Adoption Yes Vote will allow extreme policies and codifies significant non-essential spending
	Prop 489: Increase Salaries for Elected Officials Councilman from \$66K to \$70K / Mayor from \$90K to \$104K

PROPOSITIONS

Prop 133 YES	Keeps Current Partisan Primaries / Prohibits Ranked Choice Voting
Prop 134 YES	Signatures Required Statewide for Ballot Initiatives would give a greater voice to Rural Arizonans
Prop 135 NO	Governor's State of Emergency Powers - A "Yes" vote would give the Governor emergency powers in the Constitution
Prop 136 YES	Initiative Challenges - Legal Challenges to Constitutionality of Citizen Initiated Ballot Measures
Prop 137 NO	End Judicial Term Limits - A "Yes" vote would eliminate term limits for Judges and Judge retention elections
Prop 138 NO	Tipped Wage – A "Yes" vote would allow employer to pay worker earning tips up to 25% less than the minimum wage if tip income passes a certain threshold
Prop 139 NO	Abortions Until Birth – A "Yes" vote would eliminate Parental Consent for Minors and the requirement for qualified medical doctors to perform procedure
Prop 140 NO	Ranked-Choice Voting - A "Yes" vote would eliminate current partisan primaries to establish a complicated "OPEN" primary system
Prop 311 YES	First Responder Death Benefit - Criminal Conviction Fee supports families of First Responders killed in the Line of Duty
Prop 312 YES	Property Tax Refunds for Non-Enforcement of existing Public Nuisance Laws
Prop 313 YES	Child Sex Trafficking - Life Imprisonment of Child Sex Trafficker if the person is convicted
Prop 314 YES	Secure the Border - Allows state and local police to arrest illegal aliens who cross the border, and allows state judges to order deportations
Prop 315 YES	Legislative Ratification - Allows oversight for excessive Regulatory Costs by state agencies
Prop 486 NO	Will Permanently Double the Base Expenditure of Maricopa Community Colleges from \$52M to roughly \$105 million
